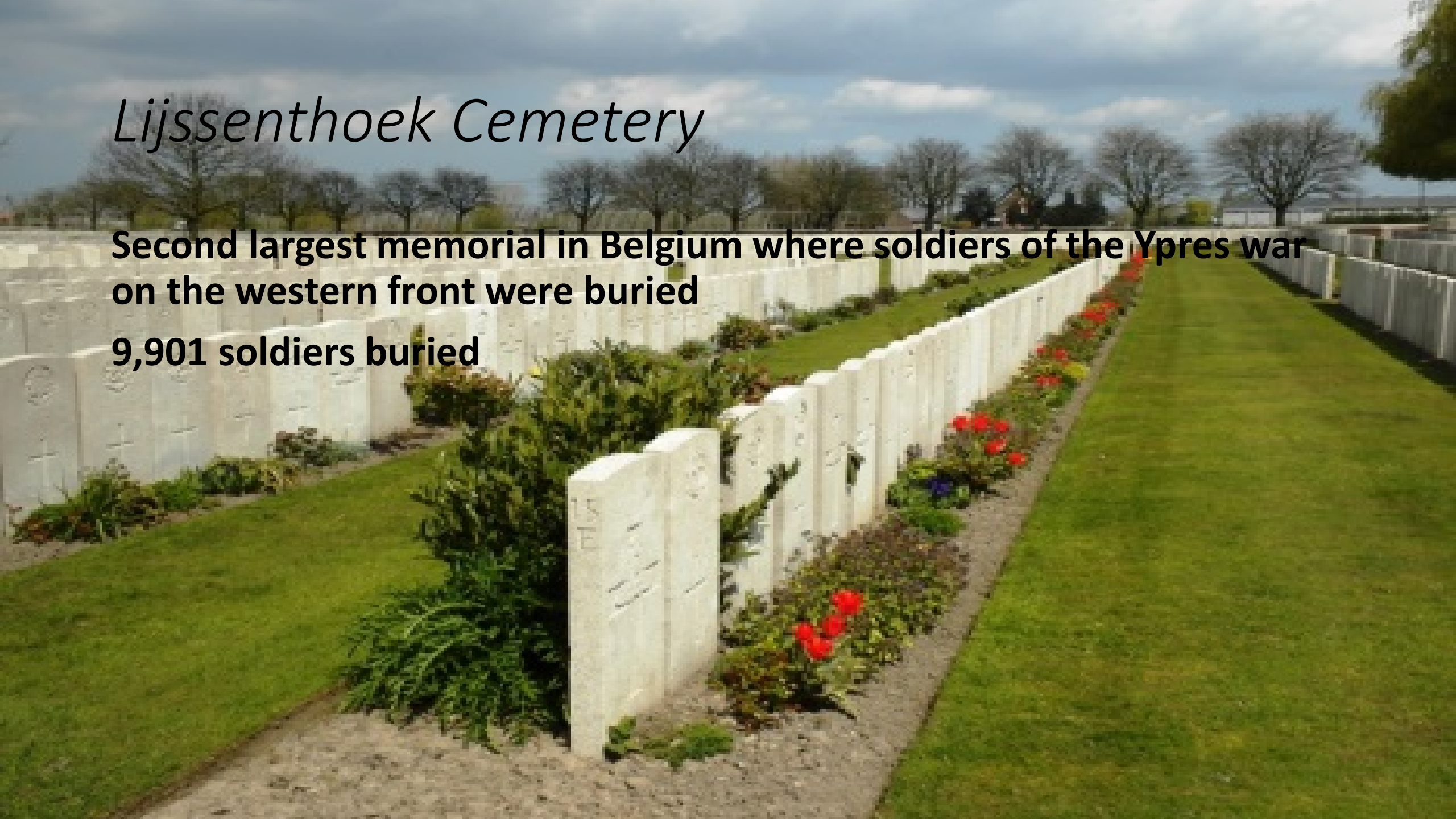

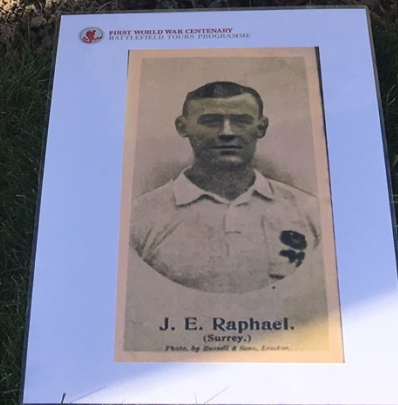
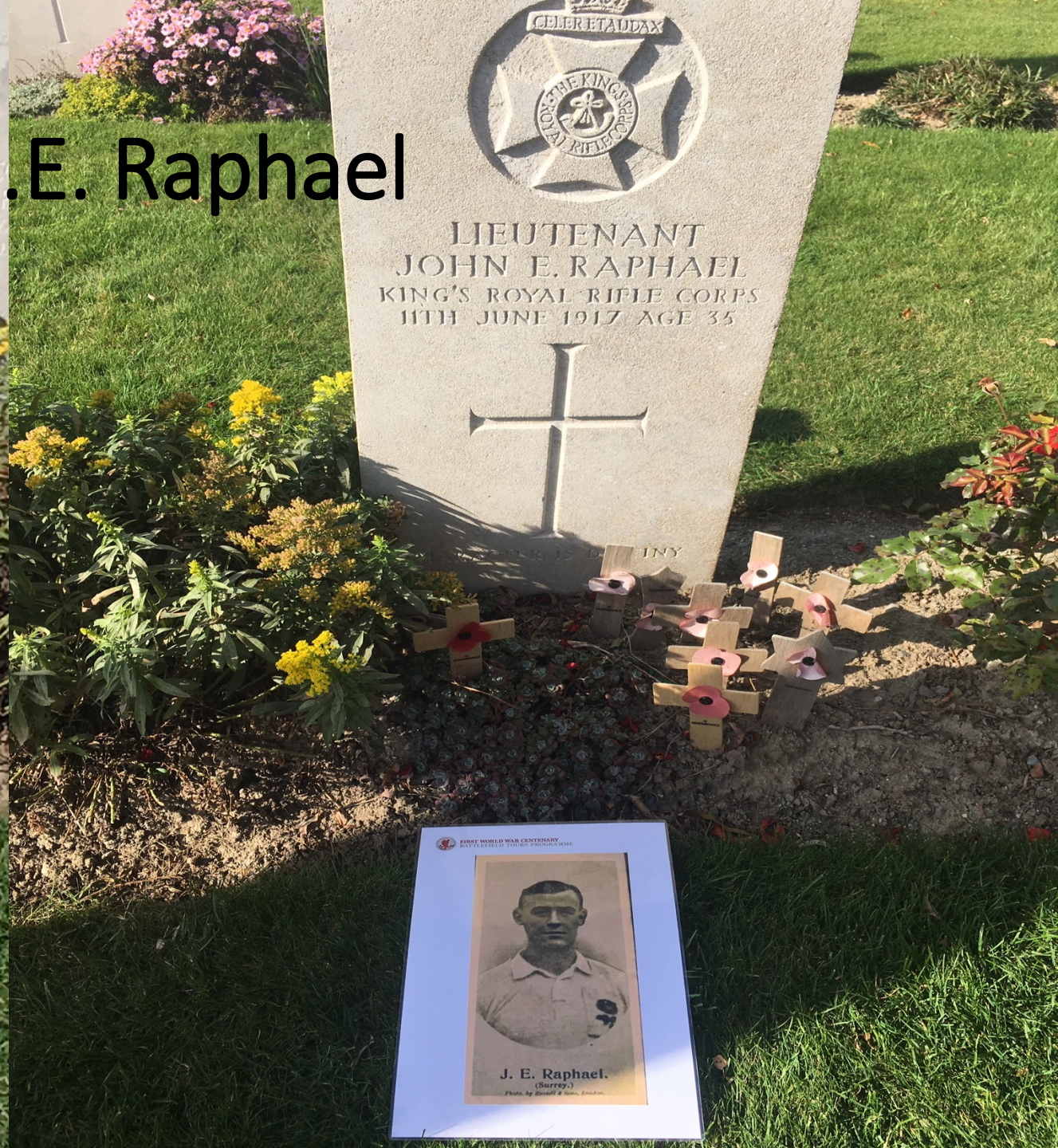
Lijssenthoek Cemetery

Memorial Museum Passchendaele

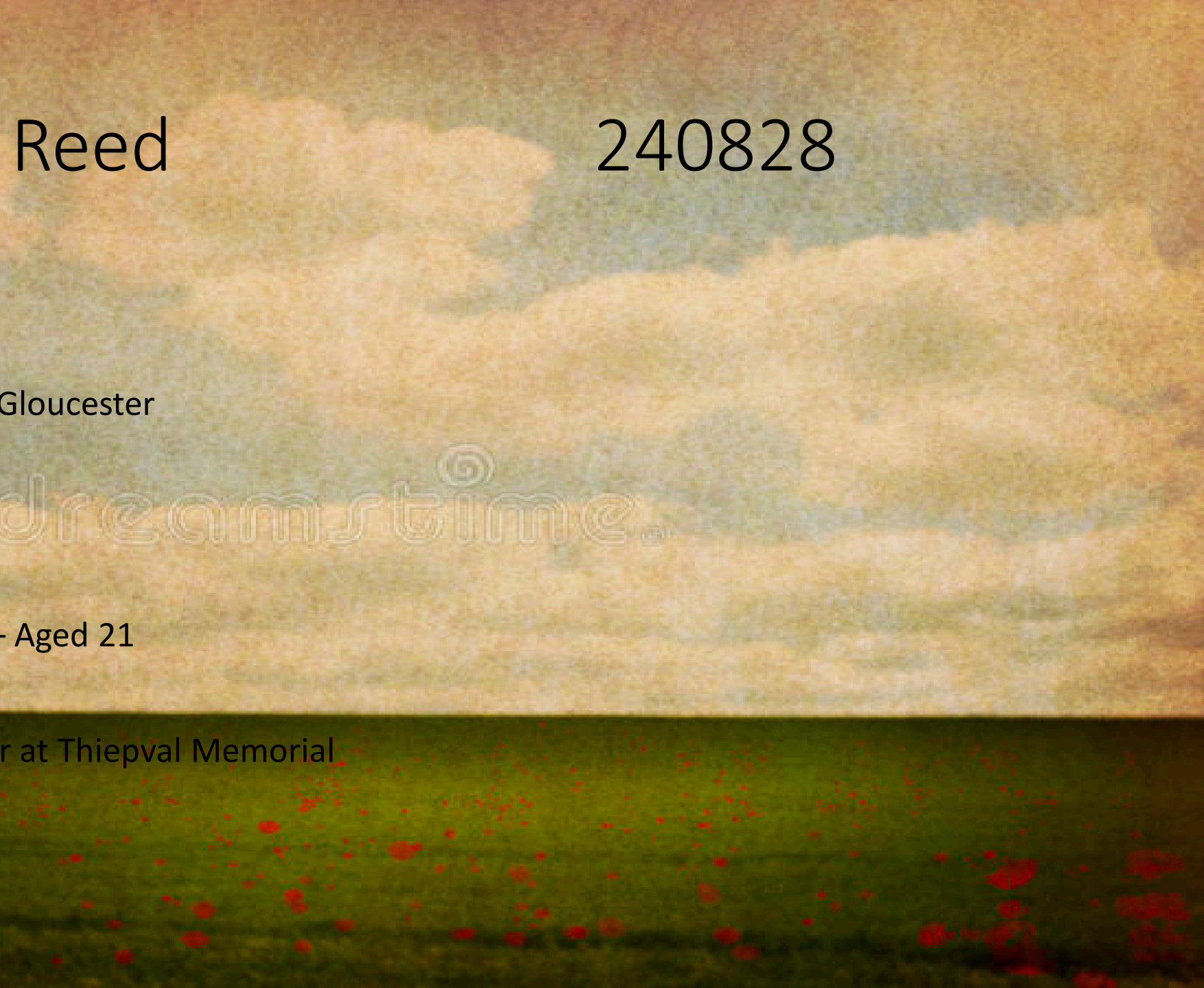

- Remembered with Honour at Thiepval Memorial

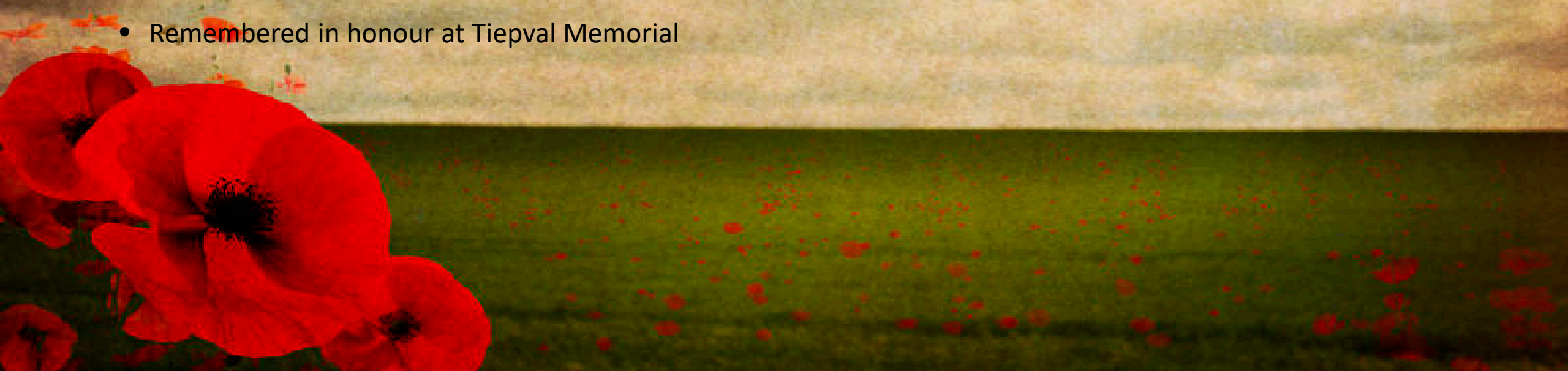

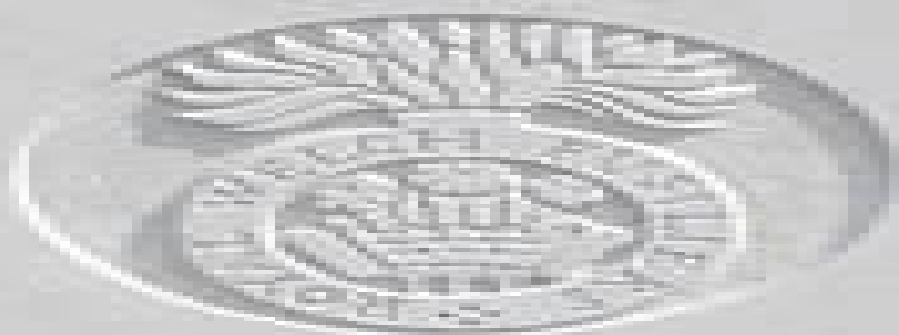

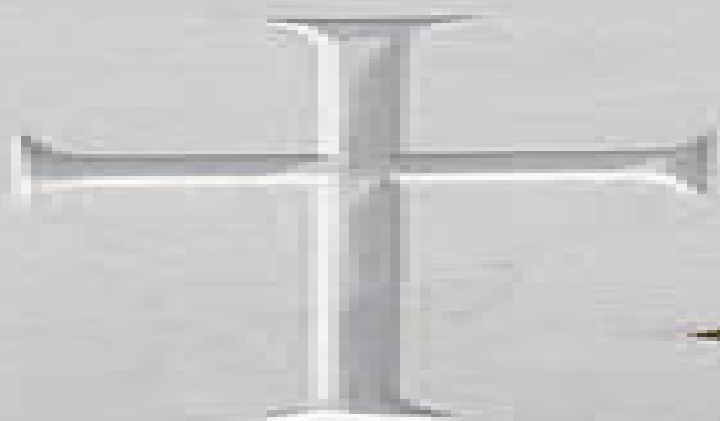
